DECLARATION OF MAMIE NORWOOD PURSUANT TO 28 U.S.C. § 1746 AND 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904

I, Mamie Norwood, do hereby declare and verify as follows:

- 1. My name is Mamie Norwood. I was married to Amos Norwood at the time of his murder in June 1984.
- 2. The time around Amos's murder was unbearable for me. I was comforted by the fact that Terry Williams was arrested shortly after they found my husband's body. His conviction brought me some sense of justice and peace.
- 3. I was angry and resentful towards Mr. Williams for many years. But then several years ago I accepted that my husband's death at the hands of Terry Williams could not be changed. Amos was not coming back. I knew I had to find a way to heal and live a peaceful and happy life. I realized that the only way I could do that was to forgive Terry Williams for what he did.
- 4. Several years ago, after much prayer and self-reflection, I found the strength and courage to forgive Terry Williams.
- 5. I do not wish to see Terry Williams executed. His execution would go against my Christian faith and my belief system. He is worthy of forgiveness and I am at peace with my decision to forgive him and have been for many years. I wish to see his life spared.
